Danish courses



Danish courses for foreigners who work or study

Target group

Adult foreigners who need to learn Danish and about Danish culture and social conditions in Denmark and who cannot attend classes during the day.

Aim

To develop an active oral and written Danish and approve reading, so that the students are able to participate in studies, work and be active citizens in the Danish society.

Contents

All classes train oral and written communication by doing exercises in oral comprehension, pronunciation, grammar, reading and writing.

The classes on cultural and social conditions are planned according to the guidelines written by the Integration Ministry, but as far as possible the classes are related to the participants' own activities and their experiences from work and studies.

The classes are structured according to the Integration Ministry's teaching model, which means that the participants are taught in different modules depending on their level, their former experiences and their final goals.

The classes are divided into three different levels:

Danish course 1 for persons who did not go to school or only went for a very short period - or for persons who cannot read or write the Latin alphabet. The course is divided into 6 modules and can be ended with the state controlled Danish Test 1.

Danish course 2 for persons who went to school for a shorter period in their home country and for persons whose primary objective is to get a job or to keep a job. The course is divided into 6 modules and can be ended with the state controlled Danish Test 2.

Danish class 3 for persons who went to school and studies for a longer period in their home country - and often they have studied a foreign language. The course is divided into 6 modules and can be ended after module 5 with the state controlled Danish Test 3 or after module 6 with "Studieprøven" - a high-level final qualification.

All participants are offered guidance on the completion of the Danish course.
